

Malawi

People Group: Yawo Population: 2.5 million Main Religion: Islam

"Baptist Mission Australia's work in Malawi has moved with the tide of urbanisation. In recent years we have seen the local faith communities amongst the Yawo grow and mature. The urban believers have come together and created a childcare facility from the women's group and a cafe from the youth group. These entities are working to create sustainable employment, as well as income to support village ministries.

As intercultural team members we stand alongside, teaching, training and developing strategies to best assist this community. The Yawo need hope through Jesus and it is an honour to share and serve in this endeavour." - Melanie

Mozambique

"Our Yawo friends are acutely aware of the power, reality and danger of what's happening in the spiritual realm. Many live their lives in fear of upsetting ancestral and other spirits, and the consequences that they believe come from that. They are often keen to talk about God and are interested to hear about Jesus and the authority He has in that realm.

Please pray with us, that as we share with people about Jesus, the truth of the Gospel will take hold in the hearts of many. Pray that our Yawo friends will know and follow the Messiah, be filled with the Spirit and walk in freedom." - Kath

People Group: K people Population: 14 million Main Religion: Islam

"Lots of work, no time," is the catchery of our neighbours. The demands of the seasons and the need to celebrate important life events in a nominally Muslim culture leave little space for seeking a relationship with God. But our team has noticed how the Holy Spirit has been moving over the past year. A neighbour has come to faith and she is sharing the Gospel with others. We have welcomed three new team members and relationships with our K friends are deepening.

We are thrilled to see how God is using our ministries – English teaching, allied health, metalwork and carpentry – for relationship building and transformation." – *Eliza*

"The B people are a resilient people group who know what it is like to fight for survival. Living in one of the most densely populated regions on the planet, and prone to regular cyclones and flooding, poverty is a constant threat. For B people, their Muslim faith is central to their identity and family expectations shape their way of life.

Our work amongst the B people is through our local community development organisation. We serve and walk alongside a local staff team through agriculture, health and education projects aimed at capacity building and poverty alleviation. We are also currently working on scripture and discipleship resources for the growing network of believers." - Ryan

South East Asia

People Groups: Various Population: 50 million Main Religion: Islam

"Our team serves in a communal culture across three people groups. Family and cultural traditions are important to them and are embedded in each generation from a young age. While this is a beautiful part of the culture, it makes it challenging for people to choose to follow Jesus.

The team's engagement through education, community development and social enterprises opens opportunities for God's love to be shared in practical ways. And we have seen how living as alongsiders can open doors to the Gospel. The Holy Spirit is at work and our team has a sense that this is just the beginning!" - David

Thailand

People Group: Ethnic Thai Population: 57 million Main Religion: Buddhism

"'Saving face' for Ethnic Thais is based upon an inherent characteristic of being 'kreng jai', which is to be extremely considerate to others' feelings. This makes Thailand a friendly nation and a land of smiles.

As our team seeks to share the Gospel, we often encounter this response of 'kreang jai' with politeness and smiles. This means that it takes time for deep relationships to be built, and for Ethnic Thai people to understand the truth of God's Word.

Please pray for the local believers and our team as we seek to contextually share the Gospel in a way that affirms the 'kreang jai' of the culture, while speaking the truth in love." - Muana

Cambodia

People Group: Khmer **Population:** 14 million Main Religion: Buddhism

"Khmer people are highly committed to their families and community. Hardships are owned by the entire family and life decisions are made together. In this context, it can be difficult for someone to make a personal decision to follow Jesus.

'It's a hard life, but a good life', a Khmer person once told me. Khmer people accept the uncertainty in their lives. Nevertheless, seeking a better life for future generations is important. This desire for a better life provides opportunities for the team to support Khmer people in a range of areas, including health education, social work, disability support, life and vocational skills training, spiritual formation and sports ministries." - Rachel

Indochina

People Group: Indochinese Population: 82 million

"In Indochina, our team serves through a vocational training centre for people with disabilities. The students are trained in teaching, business management, English, baking and more.

We celebrate that this centre is fully managed and operated by local people with disabilities. As team members, we come alongside these young people and share the love of Christ by doing life together.

We have also begun a weekly house church gathering where we prepare a meal and invite the local staff to join us in exploring God's Word and praying together.

Our hope and prayer is that through our house church ministry, our friends will have the opportunity to experience God's love and care, and to slowly grow in relationship with Jesus." - Ngoc

This year, we officially launch a new team that we are calling our 'Australian Intercultural Team'. This team brings together our long-term ministry in Outback Australia among First Nations people and our emerging work among intercultural communities in urban and regional Australia.

Australia

"Baptist Mission Australia is increasingly welcomed to play a pivotal role in intercultural mission not just overseas, but also throughout our diverse nation.

We acknowledge that the nations have come to our land and take joy in the vibrant tapestry of cultures and religions existing in Australia today. This as an exciting opportunity to spread the message of Jesus in new and creative ways.

Responding to this, our vision encompasses various initiatives: supporting churches and pastors in expanding their missional imagination, offering consultancies and ongoing coaching to help them overcome cultural and religious barriers in reaching

diverse communities, engaging with international students on university campuses, strengthening engagement with First Nation Christian leaders, forging new partnerships with diverse intercultural communities nationwide and raising up the next generation of intercultural team members to serve here and around the world.

We envision a growing team of practitioners and educators ministering in a variety of contexts, while at the same time coming alongside the Australian church to strengthen its capacity for intercultural mission." - Andrew

Current Team Locations

As faith communities grow and local leaders are developed, we're committed to building partnerships that empower locally led mission initiatives. We have partnership agreements with local entities where we serve in Malawi, South East Asia and South Asia and will add to these in 2024.

Other Locations

In other locations across the globe, we partner with Baptist churches and other Christian groups in the shared pursuit of our four key causes:

Zambia

Partnering with the Central Baptist Association of Zambia in a holistic transformation strategy.

Zambia and Zimbabwe

Partnering in leadership development and training of pastors, as well as funding scholarships to equip leaders.

Bangladesh

Continuing our long ministry relationship with the Bangladesh Baptist Church Fellowship.

India

Our valued partners include the Baptist Convention of Mizoram, Lower Assam Baptist Union and Chakhesang Baptist Association. Together we are involved in contextual mission training, humanitarian support, integral mission initiatives and funding scholarships to train pastors.

Myanmar & border areas

Partnering with Sharing Hope, Kachin Baptist Convention and other partners in leadership development, trauma training and humanitarian relief to displaced people.

Papua

We are excited to be exploring a new season of partnership with Baptist associations in Papua, building on strong long-term relationships.

Papua New Guinea

Partnering with the Baptist Union of Papua New Guinea in leadership development, consultancy and supporting the establishment of their own mission sending agencies.

Australia

Partnering in new innovative pilots supporting mission initiatives, including Nepali community support (Hobart) and international student ministry (Sydney).





In Cambodia, team members have established a new centre to support children with disabilities to grow in their ability to communicate and engage with their community.

In Mozambique, groups of Yawo are enthusiastically meeting with our team to explore God's Word and pray together.

In Malawi, Yawo faith leaders are studying theology with our team and believers are working together in income generating initiatives to support their families.

In Indochina, our team is getting alongside young people with disabilities who are being trained and employed.

In South East Asia, practical initiatives run by our team are opening doors for the Gospel to be shared, and a network of believers is growing.

In Australia, new opportunities have opened up for ministry among intercultural communities.
